What are Health Networks?

A Health Network is a group of interested people and organisations including health professionals, consumers and others who come together to discuss, debate, plan and develop health policy and services across WA.

They focus on health priorities for patients, carers and the community across every aspect of health. This includes the prevention of illness, maintenance of health, management of illness and end of life care. They do this by:-

- Planning services based upon community needs
- Developing innovative healthcare policy
- Setting meaningful targets and monitoring patient outcomes
- Promoting efficiency, effectiveness and safety
- Providing opportunities to develop skills and knowledge, and fostering leadership
- Helping to set priorities across WA Health.
